Vicente Fernández: Building a Legacy Through Music and Mentorship

Influencing a New Generation of Mexican Artists

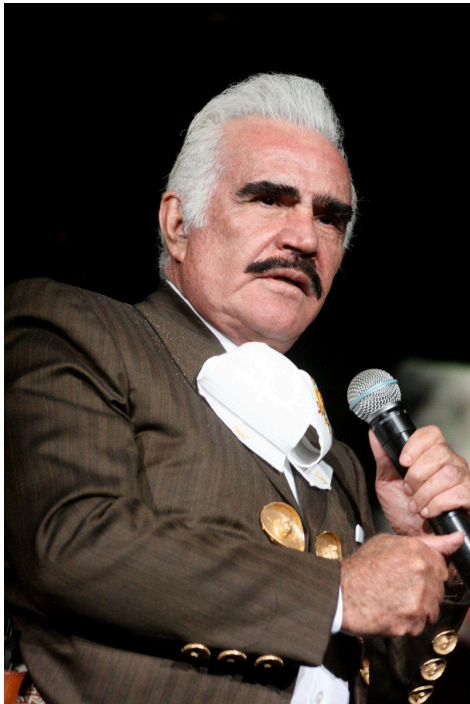
